



NEHS Requirements

- ❖ **15 hours** required per year for all members
 - For *rising members*, at least 8 of those 15 must be completed before the end of first semester break and 10 by the end of February.
 - General meetings count as an hour
 - Help to celebrate Banned Books Week!
 - Contribute videos to our online Kinder Reading Program
 - Participate in our Debate Mentorship Program (if you have debate experience)
 - Submit original poetry and prose to *the atala*
 - Submit your work to our school's literary contests
 - Attend and participate in events such as Recite Night, the Poetry Slam, and Poem in your Pocket Day!
- ❖ Remember, both your **English** and **CUM GPA** must stay at a **3.0** or higher
 - Returning members must submit verification info

- ★ Open to returning (already inducted) members only.
- ★ Each month, members of the NEHS Advisory Council and Central Office personnel will read and select the best of the entries; the best submissions will be published through social media outlets and archived on the Society blog, NEHS Museletter.
- ★ **This month's challenge is to write poetry with the theme ""Good vs. Evil" OR "Connection and Separation". Members cannot submit more than three poems for a cycle. More information can be found [HERE](#)**
- ★ Use size 12 font.
- ★ Email entries to Ms. Phelps by September 29th along with a 100 word biography and headshot image (jpg or png). Include school and chapter name, grade level, and something personal about your love of writing (your inspirations, etc.).
- ★ You will receive 2 hours for your properly completed submission.

Bennington College Young Writers Award

Each year, students in the 9th-12th grades are invited to enter in one of the following categories: Poetry, Fiction, and Nonfiction.

First-place winners in each category are awarded a prize of **\$500**; second-place winners receive **\$250**; third-place winners receive **\$125**.

- All entries must be original work and sponsored by a high school teacher.
- Turn into Ms. Phelps by October 25th
- Earn 2 hours for a properly completed submission

The competition runs annually from **September 3 to November 1**. The winning submissions will be posted on the website in mid-April. More info can be found [HERE](#)!

Banned Books Week: September 26th - October 2nd




- Celebrate worthy books that have been banned!

Scholarship for NEHS Sophomores and Juniors!

Participate in the [Intellectual Freedom Challenge!](#)

- Open to inducted members only
- Write an essay that provides a rationale for a banned book or controversial text, promoting an argument for the value of the text to be available to a wide audience OR arguing for the book to be restricted. The argument should consider counter-arguments that differ from the writer's opinion.
- Essays should be submitted as double-spaced text using 12 point Times Roman or Times New Roman font with one inch margins. Essays should not exceed three pages (750 words) and must include an informative title (do not simply use the title of the novel being discussed)
- Essays should utilize MLA formatting guidelines
- Winners receive \$100
- **Essays due to Ms. Sarah Phelps by September 30th (earn 2 NEHS hours)**




OUR OWN PPCHS 2020 GRADUATE AVA JOHNSON WON 2ND PLACE AT THE STATE LEVEL!

Induction for New Members




- Potential inductees who have completed at least 8 of their required NEHS volunteer hours by the end of semester 1 and 10 by the end of February will be officially inducted.
