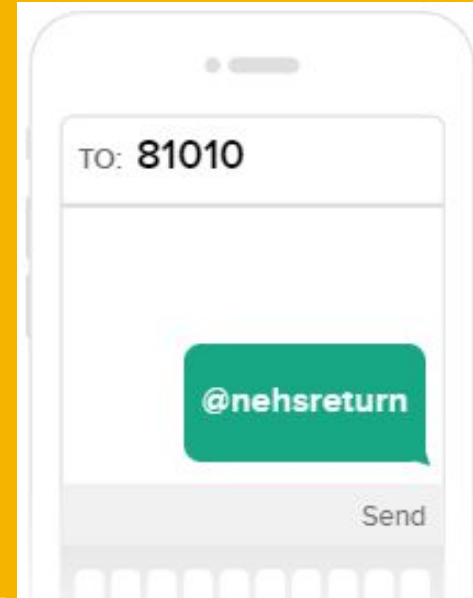

NEHS Requirements

- ❖ 15 hours required per year for all members
 - For *rising members, at least 5 of those 15 must be completed before December 8th, 10 by the end of February, and 12 by the end of 3rd quarter.*
 - General meetings count as an hour
 - Contribute videos to our online Kinder Reading Program
 - Submit original poetry and prose to our literary journal
 - Submit to our featured monthly writing contests!
 - Participate in and attend events such as Recite Night and Poetry Slam!
- ❖ Remember, both your **English and CUM GPA** must stay at a 3.0 or higher
 - Returning members must submit verification info if not done already!

Recite Night!

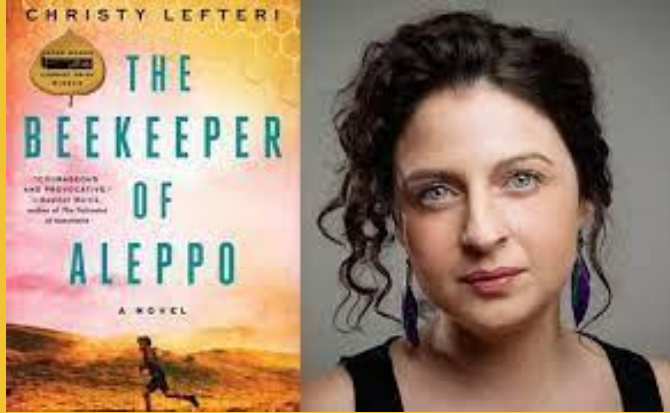
- January 7th, 2:10pm in the River of Grass

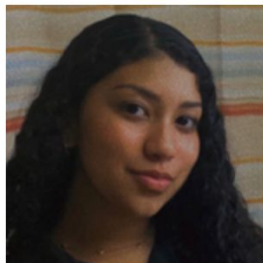
